Training Courses 2020

Wye Valley Retriever Club will be holding their usual training classes again in 2020 for handlers and their dogs. Our experienced trainers aim to give help, guidance and advice individually to dog handlers who wants to improve the way they interact with their dogs, whether for picking up, competing in working tests and field trials or just for fun. Training takes place in small groups of up to six arranged in accordance with ability – puppy (up to 18 months old at the end of the course), foundation, intermediate, novice, and open class.

Our trainers are volunteers and the guidance and advice they give for gun dog training is based on their personal experiences and achievements

Members may only handle one dog in a class. Please make sure that you attend your class with a lead, whistle (attached to a lanyard), dummy bag and poo bags. We reserve the right to offer your training place to someone else if you miss two lessons without notifying your trainer of a valid reason. There will be no refund of training fees.

If you can commit to dummy throwing at a class for the whole 8 week training course, your training fee will be waived – see training application form for further information. Minimum requirement for dogs in training are as follows:

- Walk to heel on a loose lead without pulling
- Simple recall
- Sit quietly/sit and stay off the lead – i.e. no noise, whining, barking or interfering with other dogs.

We recommend taking dogs to obedience classes to attain this standard.

Training classes take place at Westhild Estate, about five miles north east of Hereford. Please contact us if you need directions.

Training starts with an assessment for new members so we can judge which trainer and class is most suitable for you and your dog. This will take place on Tuesday 18th April. The classes run for eight weeks on Tuesday evenings from Tuesday 28th April.

Please let us know if you want to take part in our training classes. You can contact us by email or phone our Training Secretary. You will be made most welcome and we are sure you will find the classes enjoyable and instructive.

Membership Secretary's Report

Wye Valley Retriever Club Membership runs from 1st February to 31st January.

Dunclent Novice Field Trial November 2019

We held our sixteen dog novice stake field trial on Friday 8th November 2019 at Dunclent Farm, Kidderminster by very kind permission of Michael and Jane Gough. We are extremely grateful to them for their very generous hospitality and continuing support of the club.

Judges were Mr Dave Brown (A), Mr Chris Aston (B), Ms Dawn Scott (NP) and Mr Stuart Arch (NP).

Mr Gough welcomed everyone to Dunclent, and our Field Trial Secretary Roger Wiggins introduced the judges and stewards, Chief Steward Iris Wright and Judges Stewards Claire Raymond and Nicky Pointer. Rod Davies went through health and safety and Iris introduced her stewards, game carriers Steve Prosser and Sam Hind and markers Terry Dukes and Laura Peakman, Red Flag Dale Pointer and also Official Picker Up Julia Redpath

Chief Steward Iris declared the start of the trial with 15 out of the 16 on the card running, as one competitor was unable to attend at the last minute and sadly no reserves were present.

It was a beautiful sunny day and everyone made their way to the first drive, Long Meadow. Guns were split with the left on a stubble field and the right in a field of rape with a lake between.

The second drive was the Orchard with again the guns split between the left in a field of rape and the right in the orchard and stubble.

Five dogs went through to the third drive, the Tin Hut, which was straw covered carrots on the left and stubble on the right. The sun disappeared and the temperature started to drop as the drive began. One dog ran in during the drive and two others were tried on a bird in the straw afterwards but were eye wiped by the judges. The remaining two dogs were sent for birds in the straw and the trial was declared over.

Our Field Trial Secretary Mr Roger Wiggins welcomed everyone to the ground and introduced his fellow guns Mr Michael Gough, Mr Alex Badger, Mr Andrew Holloway, Mr Stuart Reid and Mr Martyn Parkinson.

Our judges for the day were Mrs Jayne Coley (A1850), Mr Sean McGrath (A3010), Mrs Lisa Harris (B3002) and Miss Clare Baker (B3700).

Many thanks to our Club Chairman Mr Morton Redpath for stepping in as Chief Steward at short notice. Mrs Iris Wright has been very generous in her support of our club in being Chief Steward for the last few years but sadly had to step down this time due to illness. I am sure I can speak for all in sending her our thoughts and prayers for a speedy and successful recovery.

Morton introduced his Stewards Sue Goring and Bella Brown, and game carriers Steve Prosser and Rod Davies. Also introduced were the team of markers, Terry Dukes, Kate Smith, Richard Edwards, Cherry Smith, Rod Gillet and Mike Gillet. Also, thanks to friends of judge Clare who came along to mark too, Betsy, Peter and Alexandra. Official picker up was Tony Stanley with Helen Goodwin helping in the morning.

Once all introductions were complete and Rod Davies had gone through the health and safety points, Morton declared the trial started with a full card at just after 9.30am.



The beaters wagon and convoy of cars moved off to the first drive, Aston Hayle. Guns and both sides of the line spread out around a sloping stubble field with very rough ground and a conifer wood behind, while the beaters worked through

a crop of maize on the brow of the hill. Head Keeper and Steward of the beat Mr Matthew Farmer and his team of beaters put on a superb show of birds, partridge as well as pheasants, and the guns did a very good job at getting them on the ground, in the field and also in the rough and the wood. There were plenty of birds for the judges to put the dogs through first and second rounds. The weather stayed bright and dry although a cold wind was picking up. By the time the judges decided to move on to a second drive, there were 6 dogs remaining.

We then all moved off to the second drive, Newlands Ditch and the line spread out in grass fields either side of a brook in a deep valley. The birds were pushed down the valley and again a good show of birds were seen. The weather deteriorated and the remaining dogs were put through their paces in freezing driving rain! Three dogs from the right were sent on a bird in the ditch but didn't find and so the judges went to look. They came back empty handed and things resumed. Eventually we were down to two dogs. The judges took them back over to the other side of the valley for testing retrieves across the brook and the trial was then declared over. Everyone was very glad to get back to the warm dry shoot room and a nice hot drink!

This was followed by a simulated trial using dummies and taking the format of both a walk-up and driven trial. Unfortunately, there wasn't an overall winner but there were some excellent dogs and handlers.

The Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retriever

The Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retriever (Toller for short) originated in Canada and has been in the UK for about 30 years. They are the smallest of the classified retriever breeds. Legend has it that hunters observed foxes playing

by the water's edge which caused the ducks to become intrigued and swim in close to shore. They proceeded to 'create' a fox-like dog that could mimic this behaviour. They put this talent to use by sitting behind a blind or reed bank whilst the dog dashes in and out after a thrown object. When the duck are close enough the dog is required to sit quietly beside the hunter whilst the duck are shot and then the dog is sent for the retrieve. A Tolling Test, incorporating the element of Tolling with traditional working test elements, is competed in in Sweden, Denmark, Norway, Belgium and Germany. I have been lucky enough to be able to participate in a couple in Sweden and Belgium with my Tollers.

Essentially you would be forgiven for thinking they were a small collie/golden retriever mix. Extremely clever and independent thinking dogs they have a passion for activity which challenges their brains and they hate being bored. They have bags of energy and stamina. They can be late maturing often being at least 3 years old before they are prepared to be really steady. Training is best done in short bites and a space of a couple of days left until the exercise is repeated again, in my experience it is rarely forgotten albeit their own creativity can be added if you don't watch it! All of my Tollers have struggled with sitting in line whilst other dogs go for retrieves that they are convinced they would be better at getting. Containing the scream for which the breed is notorious is a challenge to say the least – I doubt I will ever trial my Toller although the worst my current dog does is a slight squeak.



There is definitely a balance to be struck with a Toller when training. Fun has to be a huge part of the experience, domination and harsh handling will just result in a squashed dog with no will to do anything as they can be quite sensitive. Firm but fair with a dash of excitement and encouragement would be my watchword. A Toller will always try to train you and it may be a while before you realise. They take some convincing you should be listened to. All my Tollers have had a passion for water retrieving which, after all, is in their job description and they swim well. They are often very driven, very determined

and persistent with good noses. I have watched my older dog in her heyday go up and down a water filled ditch after a pricked duck for the best part of an hour

patiently wearing it down until she got it. If you enjoy a real partnership with your working dog there is nothing more satisfying than all your training coming to fruition with a Toller. I have worked them in shoot conditions where they are more than capable of holding their own with other breeds. Having experienced picking up on duck flights with one gun in marsh conditions I know they are a perfect companion for wildfowling. They have a thick double coat.

They are very adaptable often being used as working dogs as well as for agility, flyball or obedience they seem to understand the change in occupation easily. If you want quick results, are not patient or prepared to produce a dog slowly don't get a Toller. If you want a partnership with an animal that is capable of independent thinking and creativity you will have a blast but be prepared for a lot of gundog trainers and the majority of shoots to greet you with raised eyebrows and scepticism.
